#### Fines -Master Session.



Fines Master was Mike Murray – but before he got started his phone rang, and it was his old mate Charlie Windsor, more recently known as King Charles III, wanting to know if Mike could make it back home to Mother England for the Coronation. Mike then included us all in the conversation. Apparently, they were short on choir members to sing at the celebration, so Mike offered a few of the Rugby Choir boys to help out. Charlie was also after some sedatives for Prince Harry in case things got a bit testy. Mike managed to find some club members who could knock up an appropriate concoction. Charles was also after some people to help with the budget for the cost of the Coronation

#### <u>Guest Speaker.</u>

John Studdert introduced our guest speaker, **Bruce Duffy** from South Wagga Rotary Club. Bruce has been the driving force behind South Wagga Rotary's RAWCs program of building facilities to educate children in Nepal, and particularly at Sindhuli, a town some 120km south of Kathmandu. (Nepal population 30 million, District of Sindhuli 300,000)

Although not a long distance, it takes 5 hours to drive the Japanese-built road as it weaves its way through the mountains of Nepal to Sindhuli. Bruce is up to his 26<sup>th</sup> visit to Nepal, usually once a year, but sometimes twice. In this extended program they have built ten schools, with two more on the way, and also the Sindhuli Technical College. The program is now pushing into health facilities with the Technical College currently building a School for Nurse Training.

Bruce also told us a bit about Nepal's caste system which limits the potential of children born into the lower castes. These children often do not receive any schooling, so the program now runs schools from Kindergarten to Year 5 especially



for lower caste children, focussing on reading and arithmetic. Included in the program is provision of uniforms, shoes, books and pencils, and a backpack. The children also receive a free midday meal, which provides further incentive to attend.

The provision of this service costs about \$75 per year per student, and Bruce is looking for further donations, through the RAWCs system from individuals and Rotary Clubs, to expand the program. 
