

Administration Matters.

- Ellen Brasier gave a report on a successful week of Rotary Youth Driving Assistance (RYDA) that still has a day to run. Our Club participated well last Tuesday. In all, there will have been some 900 Year 11 students attending, coming from Coolamon, Culcairn, Junee, Temora, Tumut and of course all the Wagga high schools. It has been an exhausting week for Ellen who was in charge of the operation, so a huge vote of thanks to her.
- BBQ guru Terry informed members that the WAGGA SWAP MEETING is coming up on 16th July and our Club has been invited to run a BBQ stall. Signage is being erected at strategic points around town this week.

Flyers & posters were again available for members to distribute and display.

<u>Short & Sweet.</u>

Jenny Masters stepped up to give her first Short and Sweet, and what an interesting presentation it was. She chose to speak about William Taylor Owens, her paternal great uncle, and his action in World War 2. In mid-1941, his 22nd battalion was deployed to Rabaul on the island of New Britain. The 1,400 strong were under L. Colonel Scanlon and Rabaul was considered strategic to Australia invasion. The Australians were expected to delay but not hold the base.

January 1942 saw heavy bombing and on 23 January more than 5,000 Japanese troops landed. Later that day, Scanlon issued an "Every man for himself" withdrawal. The men split into smaller groups and retreated into the jungle.

More than 100 men were captured or surrendered, and they joined the 800 plus soldiers who were loaded onto the Montevideo ship which was consequently torpedoed by an America submarine.

350-400 men escaped and returned to Australia and a further 60 odd officers and nurses were sent to Japan in another ship. L. Col Scanlon survived the war.

Two years ago, Jenny's mother asked her if she would like an old box of photos, slides, old newspapers, and Bill's two diaries. This of course has become a cherished possession and caused Jenny and Geoff to walk the Kokoda Track and visit Bill's grave.

Fines -Master Session.

David Payne was the fines master this evening, and he focused on 'events on this day'. Inter-twined with this was birthdays and celebrations.

Gerry Page's loyalty to Rotary was praised, as he was at the meeting despite it being his wife Joan's birthday (we were assured the 'dinner date' would be on Friday!!) The Smarts and the Sharmas celebrated wedding anniversaries.



David managed to catch and fine almost every member whilst reminding of several other events which occurred 'on this day': In 1813, William Lawson, Gregory Blaxland and William Wentworth discovered the route across the Blue Mountains.

Turning to cricket, three former Australian cricket captains were also born on this day; Jack Blackham (1854), Ian Redpath (1941) and John Benaud (1944).

Lauren Jackson, one of Australia's finest women's basketballers, was also born this day in 1981. *NB: No loose change??? It is now possible to choose to pay fines via EFT....any amount you choose!!*

<u>Guest Speaker.</u>



Our guest speaker for the evening was **John Craig** who informed us on the history of "Meals on Wheels" in Wagga and the essential work it is still doing. John was introduced by Nepal who told us John was born in Wagga in 1951 and worked with the Wagga Wagga City Council as well as chairperson for "Open Doors" which was formerly The Haven. He is also active in the MG Car Club. Meals on Wheels was originally formed in London following World War 2. It moved to Australia in 1953 and was started in Wagga in 1963 where it began in the kitchen of the Methodist Hall in Johnson Street (now the Uniting Church). At that time it was a

daily service with freshly cooked meals 5 days a week delivered five days a week to each recipient. After a few years, the Council built a purpose-designed building to cope with the growing demand, which is still used today.

The service supplies some 30,000 meals per year and is funded by the Commonwealth which covers the rent and running costs. There is a nominal charge for the meals which are still personally delivered, but the whole concern is profit free.

About 10 years ago, frozen meals were introduced because of the overwhelming workload and cooking that was required.

This produced some criticism and concern, which was mainly overcome when microwaves were supplied free to anyone who didn't have a unit, and deliveries now only need to be made once a week. The frozen meals are obtained from specialist providers who ensure that nutritional value and needs are met, and one of these suppliers is from Wagga.

Anyone can purchase these meals, and many give them a try before signing up as a fulltime user.

If anyone is not home when the delivery is made, it is noted, and a follow-up ensues.

There are two runs per day during the week. The 9.30am run is for frozen food, and the 11.30am run is for those who require a special meal for the day, and this arrives hot.

There are 60 volunteers on the roster, but they would still like a few more. The time committed is about 1.5 hours with 30 minutes of that taken up with the delivery.

Each delivery requires a car driver, and a "Jockey" and training is given to all new volunteers.

Those receiving the meals are asked to fill in an Annual Diary indicating when they would be home and when they would be away as some leave to go up North in the Winter.

Delivery is only made within the built-up area of Wagga although many meals are sent out to surrounding towns which then run their own delivery service.


A FEW SNAPS FROM OUR MEETING
