CHANGEOVER MEETING PROGRAMME:

The **93**rd **Changeover Meeting** of the Rotary Club of Wagga Wagga Inc. was called to order by Master of Ceremonies, Brad Bland – who then proceeded to invite all to stand and recite the Rotary Invocation.

Toast to Australia & Rotary Club of Wagga Wagga:

Outgoing (and incoming) Club Secretary, Ellen Brasier, eloquently proposed a toast to the Commonwealth of Australia as well as the Rotary Club of Wagga Wagga.

Toast to Rotary International:

The final toast, to Rotary International, was proposed by Gordon Saggers and responded to by Past District Governor, Gary Roberts as a representative of District Governor Geraldine.

Gary briefly expounded upon, and congratulated outgoing Pres David and his Board on, the achievements of Wagga Rotary over the past year. On behalf of rotary international he thanked us for '**Doing Good in the world**'.

Welcome Guests:

Alan Lean was invited to the podium to welcome all, especially our visitors, to our 93rd Changeover. It was especially good to see a strong contingent from our 'sister club' at Temora.

Mayoral Address:

The Mayor of Wagga Wagga, Councillor Dallas Tout, responded on behalf of the visitors.



Unfortunately due to another engagement at the Wagga Wagga Civic Theatre Mayor Tout was unable to remain with us for the balance of the evening. The function he needed to rush off to was the Wagga Wagga Festival of Light – which included a celebration of the Civic Theatre's 60th anniversary. It may be of interest to our readers to know that the theatre was designed, and it's construction supervised, by PDG Steve O'Halloran PHF, who was our Club President during 1950-51.

INDUCTION OF NEW ROTARIANS: -

It is always a pleasant duty to report the induction of new members.

On this occasion we were very pleased to welcome husband & wife team, Anthony & Emily Bosco as the world's newest Rotarians.

Both come from an education background with a particular focus on literacy and the teaching of English. We might look forward to them swapping phrases and poetry with our existing membership, especially our long-time poetry bard, Gerry Page.

David Friedlieb both proposed their membership and officiated with the induction ceremony. He provided our new members with their Rotary badges and regalia.





SPECIAL AWARDS: -

Paul Harris Fellowships (PHF):

The following awards were made: -

1. Elaine Almond introduced the first PHF recipient, Vickie Burkinshaw. Vickie is the President of Friends of the Art Gallery, the Women's Health Centre and From the Ground Up. She is multi-skilled, being a Professional Facilitator, a Business Coach, a Motivational Speaker and a Change Manager. Add to these roles, The Purple Pyjamas collective and Beyond Business Group – and (in her spare time??) she is the proprietor of The Curious Rabbit Café where she actively encourages visual and performing artists. Vickie takes on a large number of roles and responsibilities and is most worthy of PHF recognition.



2. Wagga Rotarians will recall a visit to FlipScreen in Copland Street in September 2022 where we met proprietors, Sam & Catherine Turnbull. Sam has an inquiring mind that allows him to identify and resolve engineering challenges. He has won many awards for innovative, unique designs that are in use on many continents around the world - including Antarctica. Of particular interest is a machine that is ideal for the dangerous process of clearing anti-personnel landmines. This device is currently used by US and



Israeli authorities. Through Rotary connections, this device, which is valued around \$(AU)75,000, was demonstrated to Volcanology Stanislavsky, Ukraine Deputy Head of Mission in Canberra, and was subsequently donated for clearance of mines throughout The Ukraine. Sam and Catherine received their PHF from PDG Gary Roberts.

3. Alan Lean appeared somewhat 'taken aback' when summonsed to the podium to receive his second Sapphire Pin from PDG John Egan. This was awarded for numerous civic activities, including (but not limited to) his motivation in the establishment of the Pro Patria organisation, the ongoing services to community radio station 2AAA and, of course, Wagga Rotary. Despite ongoing health issues, Alan has put his heart and soul into these activities and the community is enriched because of his drive and commitment.



4. PDG John Egan also advised that at the request of Alan Lean, Gordon Saggers agreed to join the Board of the Pro Patria Property Trust which was charged with the acquisition of the former Carmelite Monastery for the purpose of housing the Pro Patria Centre. Gordon later took on the role of Chairman and since then has diligently steered the fundraising process with considerable success. Gordon thoroughly deserves recognition by Rotary and was awarded his fourth Sapphire Pin.



Peter Walsh Rotarian of The Year Award:



This award is in memory of Peter Walsh PP (1978), PDG, PHF (Sap) who, along with his wife Helen, was killed in a light aircraft accident in 2005 whilst attending the RI Conference in USA.

The recipient for 2023 is **Bruce Heydon** PHF. Bruce is a very active and willing participant in all Club activities, especially those associated with he annual Book Fair. He accepts donations of books and other saleable items at his business premises and regularly assists with the transportation of those items. A very fitting recipient of this award.



INDUCTION OF BOARD FOR 2023/24:-

Outgoing President David Wynne welcomed his successor, Peter Olson and handed over the Club Charter along with the 'trappings of office' including the Presidential Collar and pin.

David alerted us all to the original Presidential Collar which was on display at the side of the meeting room. He pointed out that Peter's name was included for the year 1999/2000 and expressed his delight at seeing Peter 'back in the chair'.
