Shine Awards



This week, we gathered at the Wagga Civic Centre for a special occasion: the 8th edition of the Rotary Club of Wagga Wagga Shine Awards.

A large crowd filled the venue and was called to order by Rotarian Alan Lean, MC for the evening.

The Mayor of Wagga (Cr Dallas Tout), his wife Janine, Member for Wagga Dr

Joe McGirr, and RCWW's most recent Paul Harris Fellows Kim Errington and Jason Frost were welcomed as our distinguished guests.



Cr Tout and Dr McGirr were both invited to speak. Cr Tout commented that the Shine Awards are an important fixture on the Wagga calendar, as they provide tangible evidence that inclusion and diversity form part of the fabric of our community. He congratulated all the awardees, their supporters, and their employers, and thanked our Club for maintaining this initiative.

Dr McGirr, in his address, called on all those present (and the wider

community) to imagine the world a little differently to improve inclusiveness. He thanked all those present for the work they do in bringing the issues of diversity equity and inclusion to the minds of others. He called on the wider community to take up the challenge and 'get on board'....there is a whole workforce out there which is largely untapped, and the evening's awardees are proof that this workforce is valuable.

He added that all levels of government have a role to play in facilitating the employment of people with a diverse range of needs by providing resources,



supporting employers and businesses, and ensuring that transition to the workforce is a smooth process for all. **The Awards**

A very diverse range of occupations were represented amongst the awardees.....from administration to dog grooming, to supermarket workers and even a museum assistant!

Alan Lean read a citation for each awardee, as they were presented with their certificates. Each citation emphasised the value that the awardee contributed to the workplace. The rousing applause from the audience supported those sentiments. In all, twenty-one employees were recognised.

Shine Awards were also presented to a number of employers and businesses, both large and small, who lead by example and provide the employment opportunities. Without them Equity and Inclusion would just be words on the page. A third category of award was made this year, and presented to Bradley Maynard, to mark the significant health challenges being successfully dealt with by armed services veterans in re-entering the workforce.



We were privileged to have the services of John Egan and his camera to capture the happy moment for each awardee. Alan especially thanked club member Lyndal Seymour and his daughter Sally Lean for their assistance. **Vote of Thanks**
