This week's meeting, held in our Book Shed, was called to order by President David, who, after the invocation, proposed a toast to all Service Personnel in memory of the 81st anniversary of the bombing of Darwin. The meeting was held around the many pallets of stock which have been readied for the forthcoming Book Fair.



Administration Matters.

- President David opened the meeting by congratulating Alan Lean and his team, and all involved in the Shine Awards last week. It was a wonderful event, as always, and a welcome return after the years of the Pandemic A special mention was made of the Bulletin team's excellent reporting of the event
- For our **Health Updates**, Jane Heazlewood remains in good spirits whilst undergoing treatment, and Alf Barzen is unwell this week, so we wish him a speedy recovery.
- > President David is attending the **Combined Presidents Meeting** next week, so if anyone has a question about other clubs activities they would like brought up, then talk to him.
- ➤ Brad Quilliam, the **Australian RAWCS** Supervisor is giving an hour long **talk on the Flood Response** at the Garden Centre at the Botanical Gardens on Tuesday 28th March 2023. If any member is interested and able to attend to represent the club, please talk to President David for details.
- ➤ Regionalisation Project Update President David has been assured that there is a lot of work going on behind the scenes, and the plan is that the pilot project will be implemented on 1st January 2024. Elaine Almond also concurred that this was the information given at PETS Training weekend, though no details of exactly what work had been done was forthcoming at this stage.
- ➤ Peter Olson reported that the PETS weekend he and Elaine attended was very informative, covering lots of topics including Governance, Insurance. There was a particular focus on fundraising via environmental projects, info which he will be passing on to our President Elect, John Heazlewood. He also noted that there were 100 members 'lost' from Rotary last year, which has an effect on clubs/districts in a multitude of ways.
- Alok reported that the three **Scholarships** funded by our club **for Medical Students in Wagga**, have been received very well within the community, and within the last 3 weeks, there have been two very encouraging applications received. There is always an effort ongoing to encourage more Doctors to the Riverina area, and Alok reported that there are now 80 medical students in Wagga and 2 Sydney Universities that run Medical Degree courses that can be completed in Wagga

Short & Sweet:

Neil Hilpern entertained us with a story from his childhood in Egypt. St Catherines Monastery is located at the base of the mountain in the Sinai Desert where Moses is said to have received the Ten Commandments, and it is run by Greek Orthodox monks. It is said that angels found the body of the martyred St Catherine (of Alexandria) and took it to the monastery where her Relics now remain for pilgrims and tourists to visit. The monastery was built in 548.



Neil's Father had a tourist bureau and he would lead caravans of cars with tourists through the Sinai, which at the time had no roads, so anyone venturing into the Sinai would have to know where they were going, or would very easily get lost.

Neil first visited the monastery during World War Two with his family and a New Zealand Soldier called Wally. They drove in one car and his Mother and two sisters sat in the Dicky seat whilst Neil sat between his Dad and Wally. When they stopped overnight, the two men slept outside against a windbreak, whilst his Mum and sisters had to sleep sitting up. Neil was small enough to sleep across the parcel seat, so he reckons he always slept the best. To get to the actual monastery they had to climb lots of huge stone steps that the monks had hewn into the landscape.

His second visit was after the war when his Father was in charge of the United Nations Relief of Palestine Refugees, and this time they had a driver and were taking an American couple.

Neil finished his tale by recounting a story his Father told him of one of the trips he's done to the monastery with some male and female tourists, one of whom was a young woman. One of the men on the trip had been filling her up with stories of monks run amok with lust after being cooped up alone for years, and the poor young woman woke up screaming "The Monks, The Monks" in the monastery that night, imagining them coming to accost her.

Nobel Peace Laureate to speak at convention

Leymah Gbowee won the Nobel Peace Prize In 2011 along with Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf and Yemeni peace activist Tawakkol Karman, nominated for their "non-violent struggle for the safety of women and for women's rights to full participation in peace-building work." Gbowee, who had lived in a refugee camp, worked as a counselor for child soldiers and led a nonviolent peace movement that played a pivotal role in ending a bloody 14-year period of Liberia's civil war.
