President David also congratulated Gerry Page on his 40 years as a Rotarian and Philip Cross on attaining 32 Years of Rotary Service.



Administration Matters.

- Community Involvement
- 1. <u>Girls at the Centre</u> is an aspirational program that aims to counteract the high school absenteeism and school drop-out rates of teenage Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander girls. It helps them build constructive relationships with each other, their schools, families, and community members. It is sponsored by The Smith Family and operates at Mt Austin High School (along similar lines and with similar goals to the Clontarf Program for boys). As our Club is heavily involved with the Clontarf program, we have accepted an invitation to expand our role to include *Girls at The Centre*. Our involvement would consist of attending some of their meetings to provide encouragement and mentorship to the participants. To this end, our Club will participate in an event on Wednesday 8th March which coincides with a celebration of International Women's Day. It is envisaged that our female members would 'attend' the function, and some of our male members will contribute by providing a BBQ lunch. The flyer for

the function appears at the end of this bulletin, and further details will be finalised closer to the date. This is a wonderful opportunity for our Club to further extend the relationship we have with the young people of our community.

2. <u>Clontarf Academy</u>: Vida Smart re-circulated the Friday morning breakfast roster. 
