The Changing Media Landscape

With kind words of welcome from David Cannon, **Adam Drummond** needed no real introduction, as he has spoken at the Club before. As his Bio suggests, he first trained as an actor, completing a Bachelor of Arts for Screen and Stage at CSU. He spent some time in Sydney appearing in national and international TV commercials, small parts on TV shows such as, Water Rats, All Saints and Farscape. He returned to Wagga to raise a family in



2002. During this time, he was also employed as an actor in Mark Grentell's feature films, Backyard Ashes (2012) and The Merger (2018). He currently works upstairs at the Australian Arcade, with his wife, Melinda. They met while attending Trinity Senior High School in 1995. He's been in Real Estate, 2002 to 2014, then set up his own video production business, Wagga Wagga.TV in 2015, which he continues to run with his wife Melinda. Adam pursued several other interests until most recently he was employed as Commercial Manager for *Region Riverina*, a local digital news company that opened in Wagga on 1st January 2022.

He created *Digital Wagga* to deal with the changing media landscape. He is good friends with Glenn Ridge (Sale of the Century). They talked about the amount of 'looking inward' going on in media today. They looked at Statistics on the changing media landscape. He outlined some statistics on TV ratings were changing rapidly since social media has come into our lives. National News is still getting ratings of around 700,000 per night.

He pointed out that Local TV stations in Wagga are still popular for news, Prime 7 being the most



popular. He mentioned that social media news is becoming a distraction from real news. He mentioned Donald Trump and the rise of Fake News and how much real news has now become more valued. Particularly Local news.

He said Cinemas are still going OK, and streaming services are on the rise. The average house spends about \$1110 on cinemas per year and about \$564 per year on streaming services.

Region Riverina is an online digital platform, Tim White and Michael McGoogan (ex. All Homes), have formed this company as Co-CEOs and Directors. They follow the "RiotAct" business model on SEO –

PR – BRAND – Expert. Business and community partners is how the business operates. 10% is business partnerships with real stories, not advertorials.

SEO – Search Engine Optimization, organic searches are introduced as "articles". He continued to hold Rotarians in on this information. Rotary Clubs are urged to take advantage of this local resource when promoting their activities.

Philip Cross thanked Adam for his delivery and his information. He was warmly thanked by the Club.



Vale Viv Littlewood
