John Heazlewood was inspired by Don Pembleton's recent talk about Hume and Hovell's expedition from Yass to Port Phillip Bay to give us some details about the trek as they attempted to cross the Great Dividing Range to the west of Mount Disappointment through what is now known as the Kilmore Gap. John showed us some slides of photos he had taken in the area in the 1960's. John's long-term interest in Hume and Hovell is from having grown up in the presence of Mount Disappointment, and last year he learnt that

the explorers passed over the eastern end of the farm where he grew up. There had been a long-term misconception about the location of the watershed peak, but this was settled last year by historian Martin Williams, who located it just over a kilometre south of present day Arkells Lane, Wandong Heathcote Junction. The separate north and south watercourses are only 200 metres apart, as described by Hume and Hovell.

SHARING AN IDEA THAT WORKS! THE POLIO PLUS SOCIETY

The PolioPlus Society is a program that began in Oregon, USA in 2012 and is now being used successfully by Districts in North America, Brazil and The Philippines.

What is the PolioPlus Society?

To increase sustainable giving, the PolioPlus Society (PPS) encourages Rotarians to commit to a minimum of \$US 100 per year to the PolioPlus Fund until polio is eradicated from the face of the earth. Society members receive a special PPS pin, an End Polio Now bracelet, and a certificate.



The original District, D.5110, that came up with the concept currently has 800 Rotarians signed up as members of the PolioPlus Society. That means that they can count on those PPS members giving a minimum of \$80,000 annually, until the virus is gone!



How to donate to PolioPlus thru the PPS:

- Go to my.rotary.org/donate and click on "Polio Fund".
- Rotarians are encouraged to join PolioPlus Direct (the recurring option), signing up for automatic giving with a credit card. \$US10 (or more) per month will qualify them for the society.
- Of course, Rotarians can also donate through their club.
