Visiting Rotarian **Khurram Khan**'s early interactions with Rotary came about because he saw Rotary as an organisation which provided opportunities, sponsorships, and scholarships..... 'a good source of charity'! As he found out more, he liked what he saw, and instead of just using the opportunities, he decided to become a member at the tender age of 19. That was eight years ago. He has since held a variety of positions within RC Hoppers

Crossing, including a term as President. He is currently the Area Governor of the Calder cluster, in District 9800 (north of Melbourne). What he loves about Rotary is how easy it is to meet new people, particularly because Rotary meetings are always such welcoming gatherings. Khurram works in the Banking sector and is visiting Wagga to attend his brother's Marching Out Parade at Kapooka. He presented President David with the Club Pennant of Hoppers Crossing.

Fines Session.

Peter Smart managed to extract funds from all and sundry by fining all those who had been diligent and had done some 'personal research' regarding the Regionalisation Pilot Project, and then fining all those who had been lazy and hadn't bothered! He tapped all those who had attended the Sydney Dance Company performance at the Civic Theatre and/or the Art Auction. There was a special fine for the lady who sat next to him and nearly fell asleep (do we know her???) Continuing the cultural theme, Peter then fined anyone who plays a musical instrument or does any form of 'arty farty stuff'.



On a more sombre note, he mentioned the passing of Mikhail Gorbachev, who had a very distinctive birthmark on his forehead. This is known as a port wine stain. Peter targeted anyone who had imbibed either port or wine in the last week..... needless to say, many were relieved of some coinage for that one!!

Guest Speaker.

Gordon Saggers introduced the evening's Guest Speaker, Dr Mark Wotherspoon. Mark came to Wagga via military (dental) service at Kapooka and didn't really leave after that, having met his wife, Clair. His civilian career has seen him practise dentistry at Junee Jail and in Junee itself. He enjoyed 15 years working with Gordon at Best St Dental Surgery, where they pioneered the provision of after-hours emergency dental services. This sparked Dr Mark's interest in providing dental services to patients who could not travel to the surgery, namely those who are housebound, in nursing homes or in aged care.

Dr Mark showed us the portable equipment he uses in his travels as a mobile dentist. It is a well-equipped trolley which packs neatly and fits



into the back of the car. He also introduced us to 'Gordon', the model he uses to instruct carers on the correct way to brush a person's teeth, and remove, clean, and replace dentures.

'Dentist To Your Door' has been running successfully for several years now and continues to develop. The vast majority of services offered are preventative, with anything requiring a local anaesthetic still



being referred to a fixed dental practice. Dr Mark believes that maintaining the dignity of the patient is very important and his visits to aged care residents take place in the privacy of the person's room.

Dr Mark is also the inventor of 'Dr Mark's hygenie', a unique system for cleaning dentures.

His work also includes upskilling carers with regard to the daily dental care of their patients. He has even spoken to sporting organisations about how to correctly look after mouthguards.

David Kennedy thanked Mark for his comprehensive presentation. Mark was delighted to know that 'ten children somewhere in the world' will receive polio immunisations as a result of his visit.
